# San Diego Rallies Around 365ft. Rappel for Brain Cancer Research

82 Participants, including local celebrities, gather their courage to rappel 365 ft. from the Manchester Grand Hyatt San Diego to raise critical funds for brain tumor research in San Diego, CA
